DENVER EXTENDS RECORD WINNING STREAK

DENVER is currently riding a program record five-game winning streak with wins at George Washington and Mount St. Mary's this past week. In a 9-8 comeback win over the Colonials, the Pioneers knocked in the final three goals late in the game, topped off by freshman Karen Morton's game-winner at the 4:10 mark. Senior Tanya Fuchs was credited with the game-winning assist. Morton finished with four goals while junior Kristie Leggio added a pair of goals and three assists. Denver continued its east coast trip with a 17-10 victory at Mount St. Mary's. Morton poured in five goals, while senior Stephanie Greenlees' four tallies made her the school's all-time leading goal scorer with 152 in her career. The Pioneers, who are averaging 14.67 goals per game (5th nationally/1st MPSF), resume their road swing at St. Mary's Friday and California Sunday for two important MPSF battles..... UC DAVIS picked up a thrilling 11-9 home win over Vermont on Friday. The non-league game featured four lead changes and five ties with Aggie junior Katie McMahon leading the way with a double hat trick. She is now the all-time leading scorer at UC Davis with 199 career points, surpassing Allison Stonebarger (1998-2000). The Aggies take a four game winning streak to the east coast this week, competing at No. 9 Richmond and American..... OREGON jumped out to a 4-0 lead in the first five minutes against Ohio Saturday in Eugene, and never looked back in a 12-6 win. Sophomore Lindsay Killian led the balanced attack with three goals, including the opening tally just six seconds into the game. The Ducks visit Marist, Colgate, and Vermont this week..... ST. MARY'S returned home and dropped a 13-10 contest to Ohio Thursday followed by a narrow 14-13 loss to Harvard Monday. Junior Jackie Spencer recorded a hat trick and added an assist in the loss to the Bobcats. Sophomore Kim Reny also tallied four points in the game with a pair of goals and assists. Senior Molly Wagner knocked in five goals against the Crimson. The Gaels continue their six-game homestand Friday against Denver..... 16th-ranked STANFORD was defeated for the first time in a month, a 19-8 setback to defending national champion and top-ranked Northwestern. Senior Megan Burkner and juniors Liz Piselli and Michelle DeChant each scored twice for the Cardinal, who now head east this week to face two more ranked teams, No. 19 Dartmouth and No. 5 North Carolina..... CALIFORNIA topped Ohio, 10-6, before falling to No. 1 Northwestern, 16-5, and No. 17 James Madison, 17-7. Junior Liz Reifsnnyder's hat trick helped lift the Bears over the Bobcats, while junior Laura Cavallo dished out a pair of assists against the Wildcats and tallied three goals and one assist against the Dukes. Cal visits George Washington Wednesday and returns home for MPSF action against Denver Sunday.....

MORTON SHINES ON THE ROAD, EARNS MPSF PLAYER OF THE WEEK

WOODLAND, Calif. – DENVER freshman midfielder **Karen Morton** (Adelaide, Australia) has been named MPSF Player of the Week for leading the Pioneers in a pair of road wins at George Washington and Mount St. Mary's. She tallied 10 points on nine goals and one assist for the week, scoring the game-winning goal in both games. Morton is the first freshman to win this award in 2006.
