USC WINS THREE – UC IRVINE AND LONG BEACH POST BIG WINS

No. 1 USC headed south stopping at UC IRVINE for a 15-5 win over the Anteaters where 11 different Trojans scored, before a double header at SAN DIEGO STATE where they popped off a 16-11 conference win over the Aztecs before defeating UC San Diego 15-8 in a non-conference matchNo. 2 STANFORD traveled to HAWAII where the weather was rainy but the pool was fine as they posted a 12-6 win over the Rainbow Wahine before heading home to defeat arch rival CALIFORNIA 8-4.....No. 3 UCLA flew to Hawaii where they took on Hartwick 16-3 in a tune up for their conference match with the Rainbow Wahine. A close battle but the Bruins prevailed 6-4 to improve their winning streak to 11.....No. 5 Hawaii played host to Stanford and the Cardinal grabbed a 6-12 win. Hartwick followed and the Wahine won 12-6 before taking on the UCLA Bruins in a 4-6 heartbreakerNo. 6 California started with an 8-7 win over ARIZONA STATE, then defeated SAN DIEGO STATE 7-4 but ended up with a disappointing 4-8 loss to No-Cal rival Stanford.....No. 7 San Diego State got close but it was not enough as the Aztecs posted conference losses to California 4-7 and USC 6-11...No. 8 UC SANTA BARBARA had a tough week posting losses to Hartwick 7-9, Loyola Marymount 7-8, LONG BEACH STATE 9-11 and UC Irvine 5-11.....No. 10 Arizona State lost at home to California 7-8 then took to the road where they didn't have much luck as they posted losses to UC IRVINE 6-9 and LONG BEACH STATE 6-7 in OT.....No. 11 UC Irvine had a busy weekend starting off with a 5-15 loss to undefeated USC and coming back strong to defeat Arizona State 9-6 and UC Santa Barbara 11-5 in conference action. The Anteaters outscored the Gauchos 4-1 in the fourth period to seal the win. **Jackie Prine, Robyn Kaake and Gianna Rossi** each scored three goals and **Lauren Machanis** had five saves.....No. 12 Long Beach State had an outstanding weekend posting wins UC Santa Barbara 11-9 and following up with a 7-6 win over Arizona State in overtime. The Sun Devils were up 5-2 at the half but **Dolores Johnson** scored for the Beach to start a four-goal run to the tie and **Christina Wensman** scored the only goal in the two overtime periods to secure the win.....PACIFIC played two non-conference double headers coming up short on each. The Tigers lost to Brown, Sonoma State, Chapman and Santa Clara.....No. 9 San Jose State and No. 18 Cal State Northridge did not compete this week.....
